Mission Statement:
To protect and promote the health, safety, and environment of the community by preventing and controlling diseases, environmental hazards, injury and disability, and by educating and promoting healthier lifestyles.



California Children's Services (CCS)

- CCS is a statewide program that arranges, directs, and pays for medical care, equipment, and rehabilitation when these services are authorized by the program. Services can be authorized for children and young adults under 21 years of age who have CCS-eligible medical conditions and whose families are unable to pay for all or part of their care.

Children's Immunization Program

- Our monthly Immunization Clinic provides vaccines at no cost to eligible children who might not otherwise be vaccinated because of an inability to pay.
- Weekly Hemoglobin Screening by appointment

Children's Dental Program (funded by First 5 of Mariposa County)

- The Children's Dental Program's purpose is to educate parents on the importance of dental health, and to promote healthy teeth and gums in children under the age of six who might not otherwise seek dental care because of an inability to pay.

Children's Health & Disability Prevention Programs (CHDP)

- Monthly Immunization Clinic
- Monthly Wellness Clinic

Smart Start Visiting Nurse Program for Parents and Baby

- A Smart Start nurse will help you during your pregnancy and after the baby is born to help reduce the risk of injury and illness and improve the physical, intellectual, and emotional growth of your child.
- All Mariposa County residents who are pregnant or have children under the age of six years old are eligible to participate regardless of income.

Clinic Services

- Confidential services, scheduled by appointment, include:
 - Family Planning
 - Pregnancy Testing
 - Birth Control Options and Contraceptive Counseling
 - STD & HIV Testing
- Adult Vaccinations & TB Testing (fee for service may apply)

Communicable Disease Control

- The Communicable Disease Control Program detects, investigates, and monitors infectious disease to prevent and control outbreaks in the community. This is accomplished through case investigation, assessment, data collection, public education, and referral to health providers.



Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Program

- The PHEP Program develops, maintains, and oversees Public Health Emergency related community preparedness, risk assessment, public information, communication and engagement, as well as organize response to Public Health Emergencies following standard emergency response guidelines.

Support & Aid for Everyone (SAFE)

- When you register in the Mariposa County SAFE Program, we can assist you with your medical and healthcare needs during an emergency event or disaster that affects Mariposa County. This may include fire, flood, rockslide, extended power outages, or extreme weather events.

Tobacco Education Program (TEP)

- The TEP provides information, education, and collaborates with community partners to increase awareness of the negative effects of tobacco on health, and reduce exposure to secondhand smoke and tobacco marketing.

SNAP-Ed Nutrition Education

- Building "Champions for Change", our goal is to encourage individuals to make small changes to increase healthy food choices and active living. We work with adults and in K-8 school settings.
