MARIPOSA COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 91-271

A RESOLUTION HONORING JANET MARSH FOR HER WORK
AS AIDS COORDINATOR IN MARIPOSA COUNTY

WHEREAS, JANET established an extensive library of written and video materials on the subject of AIDS in Mariposa County; and

WHEREAS, JANET extended formal AIDS educational programs into the community, both in the County of Mariposa and in Yosemite National Park; and

WHEREAS, JANET initiated and promoted testing for the AIDS virus (HIV) on a confidential basis and free of charge in Mariposa County. The community's reception of the HIV testing program was far greater than had been anticipated, with a total of 42 people tested between January 23, 1990, when the program was initiated, and February 5, 1991, when Janet had to resign her post as AIDS Coordinator because of the job transfer of her husband; and

WHEREAS, the County of Mariposa has benefitted by JANET'S concern for the community and is perhaps a safer place to live because people have become aware of the AIDS-related services available at the Health Department, which means that people infected by the HIV virus, who pose a potential threat to the community, are availing themselves of the preventive measures available to stem the spread of the disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors, a political subdivision of the State of California, that JANET MARSH is hereby recognized for her contributions to the citizens of Mariposa County.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors this 18th day of June, 1991, by unanimous vote.
