

## **8 MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM**

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CEQA Guidelines Section 15097 requires the adoption of a program by a public agency for monitoring or reporting on the project revisions or measures it has imposed to mitigate or avoid significant impacts of a project. CEQA Guidelines Section 15097(b) requires that in the adoption of a general plan, the mitigation and monitoring plan (MMP) will apply to policies or other portions of the plan that are mitigation measures or an adopted alternative. The annual report of general plan status required by the Government Code may serve as a reporting program for adoption of a county general plan.

The plan implementation and impact mitigation measures that are incorporated into the Proposed Action are contained in the General Plan and Environmental Impact Report. Detailed descriptions of each measure are included in Sections 8.3 through 8.15

Each mitigation measure is described in the following format:

<b>Description</b>	The description of the mitigation measure.
<b>Lead Agency</b>	The public agency or individual which has the responsibility for insuring that the measure is implemented.
<b>Implementing Entity</b>	The entity or individual with the responsibility for implementing or performing the measure.
<b>Monitoring Agency</b>	The public agency that has the responsibility for monitoring the measure to insure the measure is effective in mitigating the identified impact.
<b>Timing</b>	The point in time at which the mitigation measure is to be started and completed.
<b>Status</b>	The status of the implementation of the measure through the most recent reporting year.
