

RECOMMENDED ACTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

(Policy Item: Yes ___ No X)

Consider Request from Mariposa Middle School for Financial Support for California State grant "After School Learning and Safe Neighborhoods Partnerships." The grant application requires a \$50,000 match from the community. The grant funds would be used to establish after school programs and late afternoon bussing.

The Sheriff's Department is providing an in-kind contribution of a Deputy to provide security at the school parking lot during winter months, and the time the DARE Deputy spends at the Middle School will also apply toward the community match requirement. In addition, the school requests a cash contribution to further demonstrate local support.

A contribution of \$2,500 would be sufficient and greatly appreciated by the Middle School. The Board could justify this contribution based on the expectation the new program will reduce juvenile crime thus avoiding costs in the Probation and Juvenile Hall budgets..


If the Board approves a contribution and the school is awarded the grant, the payment would not be made until September (next fiscal year).

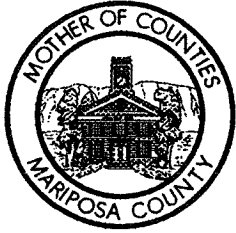
BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF BOARD ACTIONS:

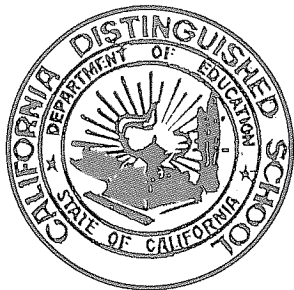

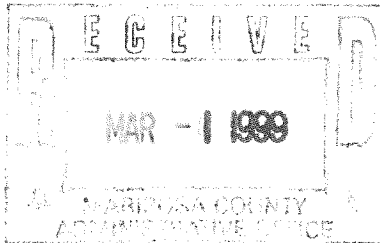
