

1 MARIPOSA COUNTY ORDINANCE No. 633

2 AMENDING TITLE 1 ENTITLED GENERAL PROVISIONS
3 OF THE MARIPOSA COUNTY CODE BY ADDING
4 CHAPTER 1.24 DISPOSITION OF LOST
AND UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

5 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS of Mariposa County, a political
6 subdivision of the State of California, does hereby ordain as
7 follows:

8 SECTION I: Title 1 of the Mariposa County Code, entitled
9 "General Provision" is hereby amended by adding Chapter 1.24
10 "Disposition of Lost and Unclaimed Property", to read in its
11 entirety as follows:

12 "Chapter 1.24

13 DISPOSITION OF LOST AND UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

15 Sections:

- 16 1.24.010 Property in possession of sheriff.
17 1.24.020 Disposal of property.
18 1.24.030 Redemption by property owner.
19 1.24.040 Sale by county purchasing agent.
20 1.24.050 Detention of property by county.

21 1.24.010 Disposition of lost and unclaimed property.
22 Any and all lost and unclaimed property in the possession
23 of the sheriff's office shall be retained by the sheriff's
24 office for a period of at least three months from the
25 date the lost or unclaimed property is first obtained
26 by the sheriff's office.

27 1.24.020 Disposal of property. After the three month
28 period described in Section 1.24.010 above has expired, the
lost or unclaimed property shall:

29 A. Be sold at public auction to the highest bidder,
30 after notice of the time and place of said public auction
31 has been given by the sheriff at least five days prior to
32 the time fixed for the sale, by publication once in a news-
33 paper of general circulation, or

34 B. The property may be transferred to the county
35 purchasing agent.

36 1.24.030 Redemption by property owner. Once the lost

1 or unclaimed property has been transferred to the county
2 purchasing agent, it may not be redeemed by the property
owner.


3 1.24.040 Sale by county purchasing agent. Once
4 the lost or unclaimed property has been transferred to
5 the county purchasing agent, the county purchasing agent
6 may sell the lost or unclaimed property in a manner provided
by Article VII, Chapter 5 of Part 2 of Division 2, of Title
III of the California Government Code regarding sale of
surplus personal property.

7 1.24.050 Detention of property by county. Notwith-
8 standing the provisions of Section 1.24.040, if the
9 county purchasing agent determines that the lost or unclaimed
10 property which has been transferred to the county purchasing
agent is needed for a public use, the lost or unclaimed
property may be retained by the county for county use and
not be sold."


11 SECTION II: This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30)
12 days from the date of final passage pursuant to Government Code
13 Section 25123.
