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

Subject: CALIFORNIA COUNTER-DRUG PROCUREMENT PROGRAM (CCDPP)

The Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) has been designated by Governor Wilson as the State Point of Contact (SPOC) responsible for the implementation of the Department of Defense (DOD) Procurement Program under Section 1122 of the National Defense Authorization Act of FFY 1994. The DOD Procurement Program is defined as the *"Procurement by State and local governments of law enforcement equipment suitable for counter-drug activities through the Department of Defense."*

The program is designed to allow state and local drug enforcement agencies access to counter-drug items such as night scopes, survival gear, cameras, radios, and other items at federal cost. OCJP, as the SPOC, will facilitate the procurement process for agencies that are eligible to purchase items through this program at reduced costs.

Interested law enforcement agencies must forward an eligibility letter certifying their suitability to access this equipment. (A sample letter is attached.) Upon verification of eligibility by OCJP, agencies will be sent a program brief and catalog and may begin ordering goods.

Prior to purchasing items for local law enforcement agencies, and to avoid unnecessary expenditures, OCJP will verify that agencies have screened the Defense Reutilization and Marketing System DOD "1208" for excess military equipment. OCJP will advise agencies on the process of contacting the military support coordinator for this option, which allows law enforcement agencies involved in counter-drug activities access to excess items from the DOD without cost, as the federal government downsizes the armed forces. Excess items include: office supplies, helmets, boots, and storage containers, among others.
