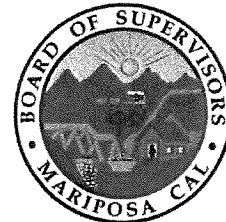

RE: Authorize Submission of State Grant Application for Jail Medical Room Improvements

RECOMMENDATION AND JUSTIFICATION:

Authorize the Sheriff of Mariposa County to Apply for a Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Access Points Project Grant for Mariposa County Sheriff's Office Adult Detention Facility Jail Medical Room improvements, not to exceed \$75,000.

Specifically, this application is projected to fund the purchase of needed medical equipment and assist in refurbishing the medical room located at the Mariposa County Adult Detention Facility. The Grant will provide funding for the purchase of a Telemedicine tower with camera, updated medical cabinetry and other needed equipment that would allow for better services for those entered into the MAT program and also serving those incarcerated in the facility.

This application package is part of a planned MAT jail based program that provides a significant opportunity to help individuals with substance use disorder, especially those who participate in a community-based opioid treatment program (OTP).

This funding program will deliver necessary improvements while minimizing the funding impacts of county government.

The Jail Based Medication-Assisted Treatment program is in partnership with John C. Fremont Hospital and Mariposa County Health and Human Services. The grant is provided by The Center at Sierra Health Foundation with funding from the State of California Department of Health Care Services.

BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF BOARD ACTIONS:

The Board has supported similar improvement grants in the past.

ALTERNATIVES AND CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

Should this request not be approved on March 26th, 2019 the County will miss an opportunity for this jail medical room funding as the application deadline is March 28th, 2019 at 1:00 p.m.
