

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS - COUNTY OF MARIPOSA

RESOLUTION NO. 68-57

WHEREAS, the common boundary between Mariposa County and Tuolumne County is the summit of the divide between the Tuolumne River water shed and the Merced River water shed, and

WHEREAS, the boundary is a physical boundary with no heretofore known geometric dimensions, and

WHEREAS, the land now adjacent to and on both sides is being developed and surveyed, and

WHEREAS, the common boundary should be located and surveyed as to dimensions to enable the public to determine which political subdivision they are to be served by.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that any surveys, developments and other improvements which occur adjacent to or upon said boundary shall be marked on the ground with a durable monument acceptable to the county surveyor, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that only monuments locating said boundary by a licensed land surveyor or registered engineer shall be shown on a Record of Survey map, Parcel Map or subdivision map to be filed for record with the County Recorder in each county of the aforementioned counties, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any monuments establishing said boundary shall first be approved as to location and dimensions by the County Surveyor before said map is recorded.
