MULTI-UNIT HOUSING SURVEY OVERVIEW

- Survey Focus: To gain input from apartment tenants and property managers on a countywide Smokefree Multi-Unit Housing policy.
- Location: Three apartment complexes in Mariposa town.

 How: 60 tenants surveyed, in person, during Fall of 2019

SECONDHAND SMOKE IN MULTI-UNIT HOUSING

- Secondhand cigarette smoke and vape aerosole (SHS) can drift in through windows, doors, and air ducts
- Exposure can cause serious health problems for children, the elderly, and other tenants with disabilities.
- Risk of exposure is higher for tenants who live in low-income multi-unit properties.

THIRDHAND SMOKE IN MULTI-UNIT HOUSING

- Thirdhand smoke (THS) is **tobacco smoke residue** that is left behind when someone smokes indoors.
- This toxic tobacco residue sticks to surfaces such as walls, furniture and floors
- THS poses a unique health risk as the residue reacts with air to make additional pollutants and re-emits from surfaces back into the air.
- Infants and children may be exposed to THS when they crawl or play on the floor.

TENANT REPORTED EXPOSURE TO SECONDHAND SMOKE

60% Have had cigarette SMOKE DRIFT INTO their apartment

85% Have seen people SMOKING in the complex OUTDOORS

40% Have CHILDREN UNDER 18 living with them.
