

Mariposa County Community Wildfire Protection Plan Public Workshops

Saturday, October 24, 10:00am-12:00pm
Wednesday, October 28, 6:00pm-8:00pm

A Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) assesses local wildfire risk and creates prioritized actions to improve public and first responder safety, manage forests and watersheds, protect critical infrastructure, and reduce property losses. Mariposa County's updated CWPP will cover the entire County and align with existing County plans that support wildfire risk reduction.

What to expect at the workshop:

- An overview of the CWPP update, including results from the countywide wildfire risk assessment
- An opportunity to ask questions and interact with the Mariposa County CWPP Steering Group and Consultant Team
- An opportunity to provide feedback on the CWPP and shape the County's future wildfire planning activities

Who's invited:

This online and in person workshop is free and open to anyone interested in learning more about how Mariposa County is planning for wildfires. No wildfire expertise is required.

How to attend:

You can attend either workshop in person or online (online attendance requires an internet connection and advanced registration).
