In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS):

Medi-Cal sponsored program for individuals who are 65 yrs. and older, blind, or disabled, in need of services to remain safely in their home for as long as possible, preventing, or postponing placement in skilled nursing or board & care facilities.

Energy Assistance & Weatherization Programs

➤ **Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)**

HEAP is a federally funded program that helps low-income households pay their energy bill (*firewood, propane, or electricity*).

➤ **Weatherization Assistance Program**

Weatherization is the process of making your home more “air-tight” and energy efficient. The most common types of weatherization services: sealing holes & cracks, insulation, Weather stripping, fixing windows, water heater blankets, and more.

- **Residential Repair/Home Modification** — in partnership with Habitat for Humanity.
- **Chore Program** — annual free weed & trash removal to provide minimum access.
- **Long-Term Care Ombudsman** — advocate for quality of life and quality of care.
- **In-Home Support** — short-term such as post hospital discharge or recovery from long illness.
- **Medicare Counseling (HICAP)** — one-on-one counseling, via telephone, to help navigate the Medicare system.
- **Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP)** — support services to enable seniors to remain in their homes and prevent or delay placement in a nursing facility.
- **Wellness Programs** — Nutrition and Exercise programs.
- **Dignity At Home Fall Prevention** — Fall prevention information and education.

PG&E Utility Programs:

Medical Baseline Program — Discounted rates for customers who have special energy needs due to certain qualifying medical conditions.

Free Portable Battery Program — To mitigate the loss of power during power losses. Eligibility is "event based" meaning it is tied to PSPS events and major disasters.

CARE Program — Low-income households can receive deep discounts plus, various home inspection safety/energy saving programs.
